Many individuals who have come to our program have experienced situations that put them at risk for unwanted or unplanned pregnancies. If this is something that you are concerned about, we can get you a pregnancy test, help you get information about methods of birth control that your partner doesn't have to know about, or help you get emergency contraception. Emergency contraception is a safe medication that can prevent you from getting pregnant if you have had sex within the last 5 days (it's also called the morning after pill or Plan B). You don't need a prescription. (Allow the person a few moments to think about what they would like to ask).
