Health Outreach and Marketing Intern (4-6 month)

Futures Without Violence is a dynamic national organization committed to ending violence against women and children around the world. We seek a dedicated, energetic, and creative individual to join our work through a 4-6 month internship.

INTERNSHIP SUMMARY:

Futures Without Violence Health Team seeks an intern to work on the outreach and marketing for our [National Health Resource Center on Domestic Violence](#) and our [National Conference on Health and Domestic Violence](#).

The Health Outreach and Marketing Intern will work closely with FUTURES' Health and Communications Team staff to develop, refine and support outreach strategies specific to our Health Resource Center materials and the National Conference on Health and Domestic Violence, draft content for websites and online communication.

Compensation will be in the form of course credit or a monthly stipend of \$15/hour for up to 12 hours a week. Interns are encouraged to pursue work-study matches from their institutions if applicable, which may allow for extended hours, if desired. Hours of the internship are somewhat flexible; office hours are 9am-5pm, Monday through Friday, with a preference for being in the office on Tuesday and/or Wednesday.

INTERNSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES & LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Learning Objectives:

As a result of this internship, intern will be better able to:

- Draft content targeted to specific audiences (i.e., health providers, domestic violence advocates etc.);
- Draft and implement strategic online communications;
- Articulate complex issues related to the health impact of domestic and sexual violence;
- Gain work experience as part of a diverse team of staff and program partners.

Roles and responsibilities:

- Intern will draft communication materials for the National Conference on Health and Domestic Violence and support in Conference outreach and logistics.
- Intern will work with FUTURES Health and Communications Team staff to implement outreach strategies to specific populations and communities. Including but not limited to: developing sector specific databases (e.g. LGBTQ community health providers across the United States), drafting emails, researching and forging partnerships.
- Intern will also be expected to provide limited administrative support, including coordinating meetings, trainings, conference calls, etc; preparing meeting agendas, materials, and taking minutes; performing general administrative duties such as photocopying and compiling program materials; and helping organize work that supports executive and program decision making.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE & SKILLS:

- Have previous experience with outreach, marketing, or community organizing.
- Have strong organizational skills, and the ability to think creatively and strategically about engaging diverse audiences in a social issue and including the ability to coordinate meetings with multiple stakeholders from across the country.
- Hold strong interest in the intersecting fields of violence prevention and health, or a desire to learn more about the field of violence prevention.
- Exhibit strong written and verbal communication and interpersonal skills, and the ability to work collaboratively as a member of a diverse team.
- Have prior experience conducting research, and the ability to think strategically about potential partnerships.

- Exhibit strong creativity and flexibility, and the ability to work on multiple projects.
- Have an excellent command of contemporary computer skills, office hardware, PC software (Windows environment); basic knowledge of WordPress and online collaboration platforms is a plus.

Applications for the Health Outreach and Marketing Intern are accepted on a rolling basis, priority will be given to applicants who have applied by June 1st 2017. We are currently accepting applications for the Internship period of July - October 2017.
