The Promoting Employment Opportunities for Survivors of Trafficking (PEOST) Training and Technical Assistance Project, in cooperation with the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC), aims to increase access to quality educational and employment opportunities for survivors of human trafficking. In partnership with a working group of experts with lived and professional experience, training and technical assistance will be provided to victim service providers, with a special emphasis on current OVC human trafficking grantees, in order to:
